Cremation has taken place and the family will receive friends at Jan's Celebration of Life on Friday, July 10, 2015 from 6 to 7pm in Cross Current Church of Port Huron. 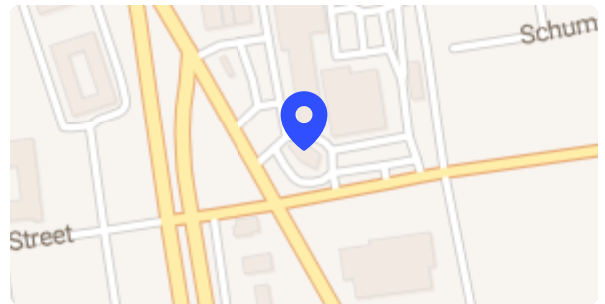
