Memorials are suggested to Marine City United Methodist Church.



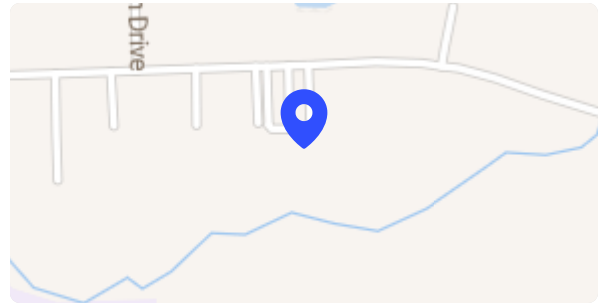

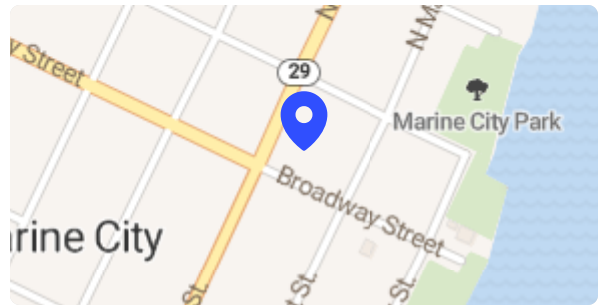
