Richard A. "Dick" Solgot, age 76, of St. Clair Twp., passed away on January 4, 2017. He was born in St. Clair on May 29, 1940. Dick grew up in Marine City the son of the late Clarence and Catherine (Klause) Solgot.

Dick served his country proudly in the United States Navy aboard the USS Blandy. He then joined the Providence, Rhode Island Police Department and retired many years later as a detective. Returning to the Blue Water Area Dick worked for the St. Clair County 72nd Circuit Court in Port Huron for several years before moving to Florida. After 18 years in Florida once again the blue water called and he and his wife returned to the St. Clair Area in 2005.
