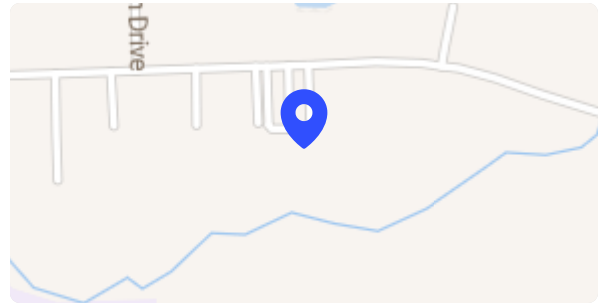

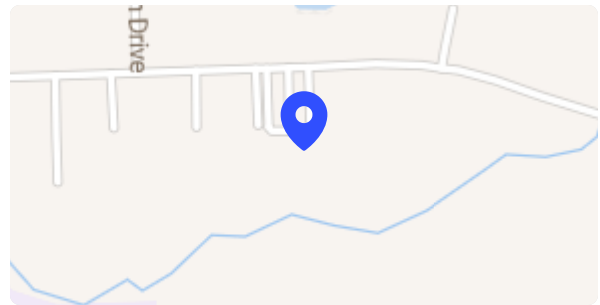

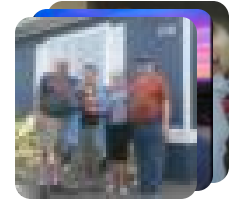

She had a huge heart for animals and a passion for training and showing horses. She even taught me how to saddle and ride on my own and when I would visit her and 'Shara', a beautiful tan and white maned quarter horse was mine to tend to during my stay. I'll always remember Thanksgiving dinners in Kentucky and Michigan and that the smell was heavenly. Somehow she seemed to magically replicate the fragrance of her mother's holiday kitchen.
