Raymond Elliott, 87 years old of Marine City passed away on June 29, 2021. Ray was born in Detroit, Michigan on May 26, 1934 to Virgil and Alice Elliott. He was the youngest of seven siblings. Virgil and Alice raised their family in Berkley, Michigan and Ray attended Royal Oak High School.

After graduation, he enlisted in the U.S. Army and served for two years. Upon leaving the service he met his dedicated and vibrant wife Nancy Millier. They raised their four children – Peter, Daniel, David, and Linda in Troy, Michigan, where Ray was an active member of the community.
