James R. "Woody" Allor, age 53, of St. Clair, passed away peacefully on November 22, 2021. He was born on June 13, 1968 to the late Charles and Loretta Allor. Woody was a graduate of Marine City High School class of 1986. Following high school, Woody enlisted to be in the United States Marines, where he proudly served his country for 4 years as an engine equipment operator. During his 4 years of service Woody was stationed in Japan as well as Yuma, Arizona, where he was honorably discharged. Woody married Elizabeth "Betsy" Zimmer on April 26, 1997, who preceded him in death on September 1, 2005. He worked as a machinist for BTM for 25 years, as well as several other companies, he was most recently employed by PTM. Woody enjoyed his greyhounds. 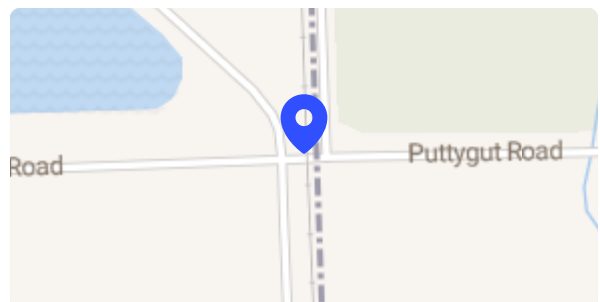

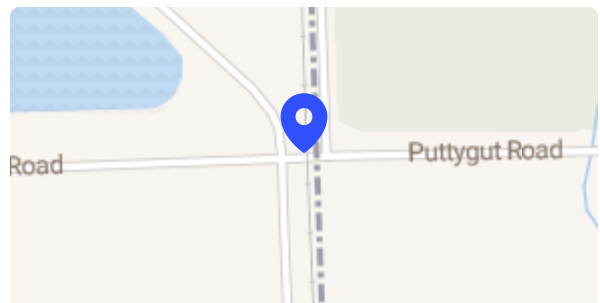
