Franklin Vernon Dodea, of St. Clair, passed away May 12, 2022 at home surrounded by his family at the age of 80. He was born in St. Clair on January 28, 1942 to the late Lorean and Kathryn (Burnor) Dodea. Frank served his 4-year tool and die apprenticeship at Mueller Brass in Port Huron and went on to work at Chrysler Sterling Stamping. He finished his working career at Detroit Edison, retiring after 30 years.

Frank married Barbara (Blanchard) on September 23, 1961. They enjoyed over 60 years of marriage. Frank was a lifetime member at the Knights of Columbus. He loved golfing and traveling. 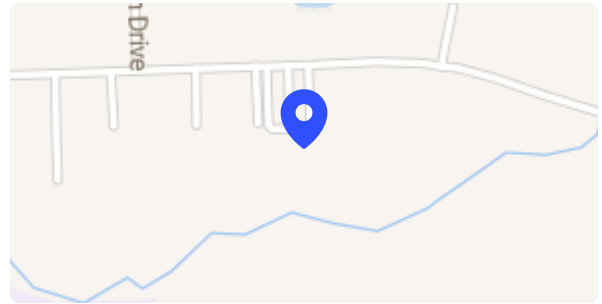
